



## Hike through History with Hal

### HIKE SCHEDULE

#### Star of Utah & Glencoe Mines Saturday, June 30

Our first hike of the season will be up Glencoe Canyon to the Star of Utah and Glencoe Mines.

#### West Ontario, Daly West, Daly Judge Mines, Sunday, July 29

This hike will begin on Guardsman Pass Road, to the top of Empire Canyon to the mines and through the forest to the starting place.

#### Scottish Chief and Iowa Copper Mines, Saturday, August 18

Our third hike will begin at Guardsman Pass to Scotts Pass and the mines. It will conclude at Guardsman Pass Road.

#### Lakes of Bonanza Flat Sunday, September 9

The last hike of the season is our most popular one. We'll visit five lakes—Blood, Laxawaxen, Silver Lake, Silver Lake Islet, and Lake Brimhall.

As ski season ends, we prepare ourselves for the summer hiking season. Hal Compton, Research Historian, will lead four hikes this summer to former mine sites. Join Hal to learn the history of the mines and compare historic photos to the present sites.

All of the hikes will begin at 9:30. We will meet in the Wasatch Bagels parking lot and carpool to the trail heads. Bring water, lunch, and a good pair of hiking boots. Reservations are required, so make yours early by calling the museum office at (435) 649-7457. Space is limited.
