*** What buildings do you see to the right and left of Treasure Mountain Inn? ***



On June 19, 1898 a fire broke out in the American Hotel (the building that stood at this site) and spread down Main Street. The fire caused \$1 million in damages and nearly destroyed the town. Park City was resilient and rebuilt within 18 months.

Find this street art. Who is the artist?


*** Find a statue of a miner in Miner's Park. What is his name?***

After you find the street art (as you face the art), look to your right down the side street.

In the 1880s and 1890s Park City's Chinese population mostly lived in Park City's Chinatown (on Swede Alley, the road that runs parallel to Main Street). This historic photo shows "China Bridge," a bridge built by residents on the hill so they didn't have to walk through Chinatown. Today, a parking structure stands in the general area where Chinatown was once located.
