Hikes through History with Hal

Sunday, July 27

John the Revelator and Wolverine Mines

This will be an easy hike beginning at Bonanza Flat up old mine roads to the John the Revelator and Wolverine Mines.

Saturday, August 16

Jupiter and California Comstock Mines

This long but easy hike begins at Guardsman Pass then to Scotts Pass to the Jupiter Mine. Then we go to Thaynes Shaft and end by taking the Crescent Tramway roadbed to Park City.

Sunday, September 14

Silver King Mine and Mill

Starts at the top of Empire Canyon and takes Walker-Webster Gulch to the Silver King Mine and Mill and then down to Park City.

Museum Expansion Update

April has been a busy month for the Museum construction and renovation. Between snow showers, ICS poured the 13ft tall lower level concrete walls. The roof and interiors of the old bathrooms were demolished from inside the historic jail coal shed at the rear of the historic City Hall building. The small stone structure will house our new mining exhibition so the tiles are being carefully removed from the walls.

Rough-in plumbing was installed in the new bathrooms underneath the historic Library building. Plans include leaving the historic stone masonry walls exposed, along with charred timber from the Great Fire of 1898. Now visiting the restrooms will include a glimpse of Park City's history!

The project is on schedule and on budget with the grand opening of the new Park City Museum anticipated for the spring of 2009.
