Buy a Brick Today!


Commemorative bricks for the new Park City Museum are still available. Give a gift that lasts forever by purchasing a permanent tribute brick.

doubled the number of tours he was leading. The tour at Deer Valley on February 9 was splendid. Unfortunately, a snow storm forced Hal to cancel his tour at Park City on February 3.

The Deer Valley ski tour begins at Snow Park Lodge at


10:00am. Learn the story of Snow Park, Park City's first ski area, and visit Lake Flat, Park City's first community. Copies of historical photographs will depict the sites as they were when the mines were operating.

The Park City Mountain Resort tour will begin outside the Eating Establishment Express at 10:00am. Stops will include the Silver King Consolidated ore bin, the Mid-Mountain Lodge, the Thaynes Shaft, and the Silver King Coalition Mines.

Both tours will last approximately 3 hours and require an intermediate-level of skiing. Anyone who would like to reserve a place on either or both of these ski tours may do so by calling the Museum office at (435) 649-7457. Space is limited, so make your reservation early.

IB Students Help with Latino Outreach Program

The Museum has recruited 10 students from Ecker Hill Middle School to help with the Museum's outreach programs. The program provides educational enrichment for low-to-moderate income students who face barriers in accessing community recreation and out-of-school educational opportunities.

The IB students translate into Spanish whenever necessary and help with craft activities. These students get to fulfill their community service hours for the International Baccalaureate Program and at the same time acquire a deeper understanding of Park City's history by helping younger children learn about our town's history. It also provides all the kids with meaningful connections between their own experiences and Park City's past.

Collaborating with other organizations in town, we will continue our programs and offer year-round activities at four different affordable housing complexes, including Parkside Apartments, Aspen Villas, Ironhorse and Elk Meadows. Activities will include learning and craft activities, story and reading time, games, and fieldtrips to the Museum, Library and historic sites around town. 
